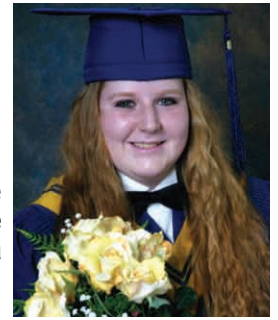

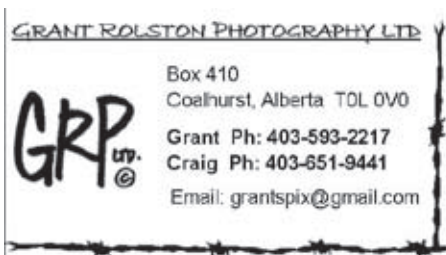
The Hereford breed is very proud to celebrate "150 Years of Herefords in Canada" and I encourage everyone to participate in the events in your region.

Daryl & I had gone to the Fraser River fishing with Everett Godfrey. His daughter Morgan, was the BC director for the CJHA and she was looking for donations and asked if 3DL had anything we could donate to the juniors for their silent auction.

We put on our thinking cap and came up with a great trip for someone to come to BC and the Fraser Valley. We would take them to the Fraser River for 2 days of fishing. We would include accommodation, food and all the equipment and boats with a visit to our favorite hot spot. We thought this would be an attractive package and hopefully the junior's promotion would give someone an opportunity to enjoy some great Sockeye fishing with us.

CJHA Calendar

The calendar project is a lot of work, and one of the CJHA's largest fundraisers. Many thanks to everyone who supported this project. As you can see, it turned out great!



The printer we used last year has gone out of business but our contact from last year has moved to another company, Cober Printing. He was able to provide us with a better quote for this year. We expect to have the final draft to the printer by October 15th. This will allow us to get the calendars out sooner and to as many of the fall shows as possible.

Costs

2,000 Calendars produced in 2010 were priced at \$4840.00. 2,000 Calendars quoted for 2011 at \$4490.00. 1,900 calendars were quoted for 2011 at \$4410.00. This is a savings of \$350 for the 2,000 quantity. The Newsletters/Polybagging and mailing services for 2010 was \$1474.00. For 2011 we were quoted \$1050.00. This is a savings of \$424.00. All postage fees and taxes are extra.

Semen Donation Project

The Semen Donation Project has undergone a few changes. Most importantly, you no longer have to match your owned females with the bulls of your choice. This means that any semen won through this project can be used on any female owned by the junior - providing that the female was nominated in the project. In addition, Hereford 4-H heifers may also be used, providing that the appropriate 4-H documentation accompanies the nomination form in lieu of a registration certificate.

Along with this newsletter, you will find the rules and nomination form for this project. However, the list of semen donation bulls will not be available until approximately Nov. 1, 2010. The list of available bulls will be posted under the Semen Donation section of the Junior portion of the CHA website. Contact Karin at the office for a hard copy, and please note the project deadline of Dec. 15, 2010.

The CJHA Auction at Bonanza was very successful, raising just over \$6400 for the CJHA, Bonanza 2010 & Bonanza 2011. National Council Meeting Highlights

The CJHA's National Council & Annual General Meeting was held in St. Hyacinthe Quebec. The new executive was announced with Kaitlyn Reid as President, Amy Troop as Vice President, Michelle Schuepach as Secretary, and Anthony Gorrill as the Communications Officer. At the AGM, Jill Harvie gave a presentation on the Canadian Cattlemen's Association Youth Development program which provides anyone between 18 and 35 with the opportunity to gain experience in the cattle industry. The juniors then reflected on Bonanza and gave input as to what they liked or what they might change. Fundraising was discussed as to how we would sell tickets on the 150 year blanket, as it turned out the tickets sold very fast and the blanket was raffled off at the banquet. In closing Bonanza 2010 was a great success and I encourage everyone to go to Bonanza 2011 in Saskatoon, SK. National Council Meeting highlights included an increase of Bonanza seed money from the CJHA to make the total seed money \$5000. This amount is transferred from Bonanza to Bonanza to offset early costs before sponsorships are received. The CJHA is purchasing a laptop and software to aid in the creation of the CJHA calendar. The CJHA is also exploring an exchange program between the National Junior Hereford Association in the United States and the CJHA to maintain good relations and swap ideas on how to make our respective organizations even better. Mexi-Mozza Beef Burger

1 ½ lb (600 g) CANADIAN LEAN GROUND BEEF
1 clove garlic, chopped
¾ cup(s) (150 mL) bread crumbs
¼ cup(s) (50 mL) EACH chopped red onion and salsa
1 tbsp (15 mL) chili powder
1 tsp (5 mL) ground cumin
salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
Grilled Peppers: (recipe follows)
Garnish:
4 onion buns
8 slices of CANADIAN MOZZARELLA

½ cup(s) (75 mL) homemade or store-bought guacamole
2 tbsp (30 mL) sour cream
2 tbsp (30 mL) chopped fresh coriander

1. Combine beef and garlic, bread crumbs, onion, salsa, chilli powder, cumin, egg, salt and pepper in a mixing bowl; divide into 6 portions and form into ¾ inch (2 cm) thick patties. Make a thumb-print depression in centre of each patty (to prevent rounding while they grill). Make ahead: Refrigerate, covered, for 1/2 hour or up to 1 day.
2. Grill over medium heat on preheated, oiled grill for 5 to 7 minutes per side, testing doneness with a digital instant read thermometer inserted sideways

into centre of each patty to ensure patties are cooked to 160°F (71°C). Top each cooked patty with a slice of Mozzarella, warm Grilled Peppers and then a second portion of a Mozzarella slice.

3. While cheese melts, toast burger buns. Assemble burgers and top with a dollop of guacamole and sour cream; sprinkle with coriander.

Grilled Peppers: Combine 2 tbsp (30 mL) olive oil, 1 clove garlic (chopped), 2 tsp (10 mL) EACH lemon zest and juice in mixing bowl. Season to taste with salt and freshly ground pepper. Add 1 EACH, yellow and red sweet peppers, seeded and quartered; toss until thoroughly coated. Grill over medium-high heat to desired doneness.
