## Wawota bull reason for a lottery win

In the Saskatchewan Hereford Association's second annual Bull Lot-

tery, the Gleich family of Eriksdale, Man. and Tozak Herefords of Tri-

bune, Sask. each won \$1,000 toward the purchase of a registered

Hereford bull.

Held on Jan. 20, 2007, the lottery awarded the lucky cattle breeders prizes for their respective purchases of registered Canadian Hereford bulls Haroldson's Global 13P 13S, bred by Neil Wilson of Wawota, Sask. and McCoy 47N Boardwalk 82R, bred by Gary J Nicholas of Milestone, Sask.

The winners were drawn from a pool of contestants entered automatically when they had a registered Hereford bull transferred to them by a Saskatchewan breeder during 2006. The credit of \$1,000 is eligible to be used towards the purchase of another Hereford bull in Saskatchewan.

The 2007 Lottery name from a Saskatchewan breeder between January 1 and December 31, 2007 is eligible to win.

### BARLEY PLEBISCITE

The Government of Canada is conducting a plebiscite among Western Canadian producers to give them a voice on how they wish to market barley. The plebiscite will take place between February 7 and March 13, 2007.

#### Voter Eligibility

- Each farming entity, whether a single producer, groups, a partnership, cooperatives or corporations forming a single operation, will be eligible for one vote.
- Producers will be required to have produced grain during the past year, and to have produced barley in at least one out of the past five years (2002-2006).
- Producers who are active farmers will be able to be included on the voters' list upon declaration of their extenuating circumstances if they had planned to produce a grain crop in 2006 but were unable to do so.
